International Congress on Drug-Resistant Epilepsy Scientific Program (Isfahan, 2026)

Congress Overview and ILAE/EpiEd Alignment

The International Congress on Drug-Resistant Epilepsy will convene from September 30 to October 2, 2026 (8–10 Mehr 1405) at Milad Hospital, Isfahan, Iran. Over three days and two parallel halls (Hall A, Main Auditorium; Hall B, Symposium Hall), approximately forty faculty members—including international guest Prof. Nicola Specchio—will deliver twelve scientific sessions, two masterclasses, one hands-on surgical workshop, and two industry-supported symposia.

Overall Aims and Learning Objectives

Overarching aim. The Isfahan DRE Congress 2026 is a three-day scientific program designed to instruct participants in the ILAE core competencies related to the diagnosis of drug-resistant epilepsy, its pharmacologic and surgical treatment, referral and counseling, and the management of comorbidities—core competencies 1, 2, 3, and 6, extended with surgical and emergency competencies (4,5) where the congress content requires them.

Competency 1 — Etiology and diagnostics. After attending the congress sessions on classification, semiology, neurogenetics, and imaging, the participant will be able to:

- **1.1.1 (L1)** describe the major etiologies of seizures and epilepsies—structural, genetic, infectious, metabolic, immune, and neurodegenerative—as applied to drug-resistant cohorts.
- **1.2.1 (L2)** decide whom to test genetically and **1.2.2 (L3)** select the appropriate type of testing, with **1.2.3 (L3)** interpretation of results applied to the Day-2 neurogenetics content of the congress program.
- **1.5.2 (L1)** decide whom to image and **1.5.3 (L2)** determine when to image or repeat imaging, including 3T epilepsy-protocol MRI indications in surgical candidates.
- **1.8.2 (L2)** recognize the semiology of psychogenic non-epileptic seizures and the role of video-EEG and suggestion techniques, supporting the comorbidity and PNES content of the congress.

Competency 2 — Counseling and referral. The participant will be able to:

- **2.1 (L1)** address culturally appropriate aspects of diagnosis, including stigma, when communicating a diagnosis of drug-resistant epilepsy.

- **2.2.2 (L1)** counsel on lifestyle factors — driving, sports, stress, sleep, and adherence — and **2.2.3 (L1)** deliver seizure-safety advice.
- **2.3.2 (L2)** educate patients and families on prognosis and risk factors, and **2.3.5 (L1)** counsel on adverse effects of antiseizure medications, including polytherapy in refractory patients.
- **2.4.1 (L2)** advise patients in remission and **2.4.2 (L2)** advise patients with uncontrolled seizures, including the transition from pharmacologic to surgical pathways.
- **2.5 (L1)** recognize when to refer for higher-level care — video-EEG monitoring, pre-surgical evaluation, lesional or uncontrolled epilepsy, epileptic encephalopathy, psychiatric comorbidity, and genetic counseling — which is the central referral objective of the congress.
- **2.6 (L2)** counsel women of childbearing age on teratogenicity and pregnancy planning.
- **2.10.1–2.10.3 (L1–L2)** communicate the diagnosis and psychological treatment potential of PNES and counsel on tapering inappropriate antiseizure medications and the role of anxiolytics and antidepressants.

Competency 3 — Pharmacologic treatment. The participant will be able to:

- **3.1.2 (L1)** explain the pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics of antiseizure medications relevant to combination therapy in refractory epilepsy.
- **3.2.2 (L2)** recommend therapy according to epilepsy syndrome, including syndrome-specific regimens in pediatric and adolescent populations with drug-resistant epilepsy.
- **3.3.4 (L2)** discuss treatment strategies for sexual function and dysfunction related to antiseizure medication exposure.

Competency 4,5 - Surgical and emergency extensions (L2–L3). The participant will additionally be able to describe the diagnostic work-up and candidacy criteria for resective and disconnective surgery, neuromodulation (VNS, DBS, RNS), and stereotactic procedures, and to apply status epilepticus protocols in acute settings.

Competency 6 — Comorbidities. The participant will be able to **6.1.1 (L2)** recognize psychiatric comorbidities — depression, anxiety, ADHD, psychosis, and autism spectrum disorder — in patients with drug-resistant epilepsy, and **6.2 (L2)** diagnose and manage relevant somatic comorbidities in this population.

Assessment, Certification and Continuing Education Credits

In line with the assessment tools defined in the EpiEd curriculum, the congress incorporates the following evaluation and certification mechanisms:

- **Case-based assessment.** The SEEG masterclass, complex pediatric case presentations, and the autoimmune encephalitis masterclass are structured as interactive, case-based examinations of clinical reasoning, consistent with the EpiEd recommendation of case-based testing for postgraduate epileptology training.
- **Modular interim certification.** Following the modular seven-block EpiEd model, each completed masterclass and workshop may be certified as an interim module, enabling participants to accumulate credit toward Level 1 (GOSI) competence; Level 2 (COE) content is flagged for comprehensive-epilepsy-center practitioners.
- **Continuing medical education.** Formal CME credit is requested from the Iranian Ministry of Health and Medical Education; international attendees receive an attendance certificate that itemizes EpiEd domains and contact hours for submission to their national ILAE chapter.
